#### **Reminders**

**Clothing Collection:** This will definitely be going ahead and we are waiting on confirmation of a collection date, so please hold on to those bags for a few more weeks!

Music tuition: has resumed for both Strings and Wind instruments with Mrs Mullan and Mr Tohill respectively. There is no further information about fees for the year.

Education Authority are instructing their tutors to focus on existing students and wait until later in the term/year before considering new starts.

**Start of school: Y2-7 children** should arrive at 8.50am. *It is very important that children are not 'dropped off' before 8.50am as there is no supervision.* The back gate closes at 9.05am. Latecomers must go through the front door. Any busy house can have a late morning but when it happens more than once a pattern can build up and this is to be avoided.

**Start of school: Y1 children** are now well-used to the hustle and bustle as everyone arrives at the start of the day. From Monday 12<sup>th</sup> October all Y1 should be in school for 9am start. Until then, if it is possible and they are happy to do so we will welcome them from 8.50am.

### **PE Arrangements**


Teachers of Y2-7 will also be in touch by phone over the coming weeks

How to pray the rosary

- Starter prayers: Our Father, 3 x Hail Mary, Glory be to the Father
- For each story, think about what was happening.
  - While you are thinking, pray Our Father, 10 x Hail Mary, Glory be to the Father.
  - ➤ You don't have to pray all 5 stories (mysteries) at once just pick one, think about it and say OF, 10xHM & GB (can you work out what this means?)

The Joyful Mysteries (Happy stories from the bible)

- 1. The Annunciation. The Angel Gabriel told Mary she was going to have a baby Jesus.
- 2. The Visitation. Mary went to tell Elizabeth that she was having a baby and Elizabeth told Mary she was having one, too!
- 3. The Nativity the story of Christmas
- 4. The Presentation of our Lord Jesus in the temple (when he was a baby). The wise men in the temple said he would be a great leader.
- 5. The finding of Our Lord Jesus in the temple (when he was 12 years old). After being missing for a few days, Mary & Joseph finally found Jesus in the temple. He said that they should not have been worrying as he was in his Father's house

Why not pray a decade at home? The children should be able to tell you a little about what they know.
